Children's Bureau, Inc. was founded in 1851, making our agency the second nonprofit established in Indianapolis. As the social needs in our community have changed, we have adapted throughout the years to provide a variety of quality services to children and families.

Our agency has been privileged to help provide children with families through adoption services since the late 1800s, also making us one of the longest operating adoption providers in Indiana.

Our staff of nearly 400 specialize in providing child abuse prevention services and services to intervene after some type of child abuse has occurred. We are constantly implementing the most current treatment models to ensure that the care that we provide for children and families is the most effective form of treatment available. Children's Bureau also specializes in providing treatment to children who have experienced traumatic events and who are struggling to recover.

We currently operate 20 different programs in over 40 counties across the state. In 2015, we touched the lives of 46,500 children in many ways, ranging from providing shelter to homeless children to assisting youth who are transitioning into adulthood from the foster care system. Examples of some of our more progressive programs include the specialized programming to help fathers re-engage with their estranged children, group treatment for families who struggle with addictions, and intensive therapy for children who have attachment and bonding difficulties.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this organization shall be “The Children’s Bureau Auxiliary, Inc.”

ARTICLE II

Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to assist the Board of Directors and the staff of Children’s Bureau, Inc. by interpreting the work of the Bureau to the community, by providing volunteer assistants and by raising funds to augment the programs of the Bureau.

ARTICLE III

Membership

Section 1. There shall be five classes of members: active, associate, sustaining, honorary and inactive. All classes of membership shall be unlimited in size.

Section 2. An active member is expected to participate actively in the work of the organization and attend as many monthly meetings as possible, has voting privileges, and shall pay annual dues. An active member becomes an associate member after completing 5 years of active membership.

Section 3. An associate member is one who has completed her active membership as specified. She shall support the activities of the organization, pay annual dues, and attend as many monthly meetings as possible.

Section 4. A sustaining member maintains membership without assuming active duties, which include voting and holding office privileges. A member may request sustaining status after (3) three years of associate membership by submitting a written request for action by the Executive Committee. Such written request must be accompanied by payment of sustaining membership dues.

Section 5. An inactive member is an active or associate member who has submitted a request and has been granted inactive membership by the Executive Committee. Inactive members who have not resumed active or associate status or requested sustaining status after two years shall forfeit membership unless exception is made by the Administrative Board.

Inactive members have no service requirements and no voting privileges. Local inactive members shall be responsible for any assessment voted by the membership. Any inactive member eligible for active, associate or sustaining membership must request reinstatement to that status before May first.

Section 6. An honorary member is one who is privileged to maintain her membership without assuming duties or financial obligations. An honorary member does not have voting privileges, nor may she hold office.

ARTICLE IV

Election of Members

Section 1. New members may be accepted into the organization throughout the year.

Section 2. An honorary member may be recommended by the Administrative Board after written proposal by any member of the Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V

Dues and Assessments

Section 1. The annual dues for active and associate members shall be payable at the first regular meeting and shall be delinquent after the second regular meeting in. Any member who is delinquent for two years shall lose her status as a member, unless the Administrative Board makes exception.

Section 2. The one-time fee for sustaining membership is payable in full upon request of sustaining status unless special arrangements are made with the treasurer.

ARTICLE VI

Duties of Officers

Section 1. The officers shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 2. The President shall be responsible for directing the welfare and progress of the organization, and she shall preside at the meetings, call special meetings and select all committees except Nominating/Placement. She shall present measures to the Executive Committee, call its meetings and attend the meetings of the Board of Directors of Children's Bureau, Inc. The President shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except Nominating/Placement.

Section 3. The Vice President or the President's designee shall assist the President, act in her absence, serve as chairman of the Reviewing

Committee, and coordinate the Wish List. At the President's request, or in her absence, the Vice President or the President's designee may attend committee meetings in ex-officio capacity. The Vice President may attend meetings of the Children's Bureau, Inc. Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings and any records pertaining to the organization. In addition, she shall conduct the correspondence of the Auxiliary.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall collect dues from members and shall manage the finances of the organization. She shall submit all books or record of accounts of the organization for an annual financial review by a Certified Public Accountant. She shall make a regular report to the Executive Committee and general membership and shall serve as chairman of the Finance Committee.

ARTICLE VII

Duties and Meetings of the Executive Committee

and the Administrative Board

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers, the Past President, Courage Center Chairman, Clerical/Mailings Chairman, Family Support Center Chairman, Fund Raising Chairmen and the Parliamentarian. Any other member of the Auxiliary whom the President deems necessary may be invited to attend the Executive Committee.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall act as an advisory council to the President and shall be subject to her call. The Executive Committee shall act on requests for change of classification of membership as per Article III, Sections 4 and 5, and shall act on delinquencies in requirements for membership as per Article III, Sections 2 and 3, in months when the Administrative Board is not meeting.

Section 3. The Administrative Board shall consist of the Executive Committee and the Chairmen of all standing committees. Any other member of the Auxiliary whom the President deems necessary may be invited to attend the administrative meetings.

Section 4. The Administrative Board shall act as an advisory council to the President and shall be subject to her call. The Administrative Board shall act on delinquencies in requirements of membership as stated in Article III, Sections 2 and 3 and Article V, Section 1, and may recommend persons for honorary membership as per Article IV, Section 2.

Section 5. A meeting of the Administrative Board shall be held in conjunction with the general meeting in September and as called by the President. Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held prior to

general meetings as needed.

ARTICLE VIII

Election of Officers and Nominating/Placement Committee

Section 1. The Nominating/Placement Committee shall present a slate of officers and a slate of members to serve on the Nominating/Placement Committee for the ensuing year. These nominees shall be elected annually by the active and associate membership of the Auxiliary.

Section 2. The Nominating/Placement Committee shall consist of five members. The membership of this committee shall include the Past President and four active and/or associate members. One of the associate members other than the Past President shall serve as chairman. Auxiliary members may not serve on this committee for more than two consecutive years unless by special appointment by the President. The committee shall fill any vacated elective office by appointment. The chairman may fill any vacant positions for this committee with any active or associate member.

ARTICLE IX

Meetings

Section 1. The general meetings of the Auxiliary shall be held on a regular basis throughout the year.

Section 2. The first regular general meeting shall be designated as the Annual Meeting of the Auxiliary, at which time the budget shall be approved.

Section 3. Twenty-five percent (25%) of voting membership (actives and associates) shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE X

Standing Rules

Section 1. There shall be written Standing Rules, which shall include a list of Standing Committees, the duties of each and general policies of the Auxiliary.

Section 2. The Reviewing Committee shall be responsible for keeping the Standing Rules up to date, subject to membership approval.

ARTICLE XI

Amendments

The Bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting, provided there is a quorum and provided that such amendment, in writing, shall have been presented for consideration prior to the meeting.

ARTICLE XII

Rules of Order

Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised shall govern this organization in all cases in which they are not inconsistent with the Bylaws and Standing Rules.

ARTICLE XIII

Dissolution

Upon dissolution of The Children's Bureau Auxiliary, Inc., all assets shall be donated to Children's Bureau, Inc.

STANDING RULES

A. Committees

Chairmen of each committee shall present a plan for the upcoming year at the first meeting, a progress report mid-year, and a report at the year-end meeting.

Clerical/Mailings - shall be called upon by the Bureau for assistance as needed and shall handle mailings for the Auxiliary as requested.

Courage Center - The committee for Courage Center shall coordinate all activities of the Auxiliary at Courage Center under the leadership/guidance of the Vice President or the President's designee.

Family Support Center - shall coordinate all activities of the Auxiliary at the Gene Glick Family Support Center.

Finance - shall be responsible for preparing the budget and presenting it for approval at the Annual Meeting of the Auxiliary. This committee shall be composed of the Treasurer, President, Vice President, Past President, Past Treasurer, those Auxiliary members working with Ways and Means projects accounts and a representative of Children's Bureau, Inc. The Treasurer shall serve as chairman of this committee, with the privilege of designating additional committee members from the Auxiliary.

Historian/Web Coordinator - shall be responsible for organizing records and photo albums of the activities of the organization in order to foster pride and appreciation in the members for the work of the Auxiliary. The Historian/Web Coordinator shall be responsible for compiling and maintaining the Auxiliary's webpage in cooperation with the Bureau's webmaster.

Nominating/Placement - Nominating/Placement shall present a slate of officers and Nominating/Placement Committee members for election at the April meeting. This committee shall advise and assist the incoming President in determining committee chairmen and members. This

committee shall fill any vacated elective office by appointment.

Parliamentarian - shall oversee matters of parliamentary procedure and shall ensure that the organization is governed by Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised in cases in which they are not inconsistent with the Bylaws and Standing Rules of the organization.

Recognition - shall plan and coordinate activities of the Auxiliary and coordinate the Staff Recognition luncheon and the year end luncheon or dinner. The Auxiliary shall select the Mallon Award recipient and present that award at the year-end luncheon or dinner unless exception is made. The honoree shall be a member of the Bureau, the Board of Directors, the Auxiliary or a member of the community who has rendered outstanding service to the Auxiliary or the Bureau.

Reflector - shall be responsible for the publication and distribution of the Auxiliary's newsletter.

Reviewing - shall meet each year to review all policies and activities of the Auxiliary and to update the Standing Rules, subject to membership approval. It shall also make recommendations for any changes in the Bylaws. This committee shall consist of the President, Past President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Sustaining Representative and Parliamentarian as well as the chairmen of Nominating/Placement and Yearbook. The incoming President or a designee of the President shall serve as chairman of this committee, with the privilege of designating additional members from the Auxiliary.

Sustaining Rep - shall be responsible for representing sustainers in matters pertaining to members of sustaining status. The sustaining rep shall encourage, facilitate and coordinate the involvement of sustainers in the organization.

Ways and Means Projects - shall have charge of the fund raising projects of the Auxiliary. There shall be a separate committee for each project.

Wish List for Children's Bureau, Inc. - shall coordinate the donation by Auxiliary members of items needed or requested by Children's Bureau, Inc.

Yearbook - shall be responsible for the publication, distribution, and updating of the yearbook throughout the year.

B. Financial Administration

In general, the Treasurer shall handle all administrative funds and shall handle funds involving service to agency clients. The Treasurer shall

handle dues, interest on investments and bonds, yearbook and Reflector costs, staff education, scholarships, miscellaneous expenses and other duties as required.

Dues and Fees:

- (1) Annual dues for active and associate members will be \$50. A one-time fee for sustaining members will be \$150.
- (2) The Treasurer shall bill all members whose dues are unpaid as of November 30 each year. If dues are unpaid, the Treasurer shall send a second notice, setting forth Article V, Section 1 of the Bylaws.
- (3) All active, associate and local inactive members shall pay any assessment voted by the membership. The Treasurer shall bill any member who has not paid.
- (4) The Administrative Board shall review delinquencies in dues at the end of the year and may revoke the membership of any active or associate member who has been delinquent for two consecutive years.

C. Pink Slips

A pink slip is a request for funds for a specific purpose presented by Children's Bureau, Inc. staff to Children's Bureau Auxiliary. Pink slips serve as the financial record for Auxiliary accounting purposes.

- (1) Pink slips for current budgeted items not exceeding \$500.00 or outside the scope of the budget shall be approved by the President and appropriate committee chairman prior to presentation to the general membership for ratification.
- (2) Pink slips in excess of \$500.00 or outside the scope of the budget shall be presented to the Auxiliary membership for a vote.
- (3) Pink slips that are received between the board meeting and the general meeting shall be approved by the President and appropriate committee chairman and shall be presented directly to the Auxiliary membership for a vote.
- (4) During the summer months, the President shall have the authority to approve pink slips with a \$300.00 limit per pink slip.

D. Miscellaneous

Reservations not canceled prior to the deadline must be paid by the member who made the reservation.
